Cub Scout Camping Awards

The awards below are designed to encourage packs to include enough outdoor activities throughout the year to keep boys interested and having fun. Visit www.scouting.org to learn more about each individual award and to find current requirements.

National Summertime Pack Award



The purpose of the National Summertime Pack Award is to encourage packs to provide a year-round program by continuing to meet during the time periods when school is out of session. For the pack, the possibility of earning the award can be an incentive for more participation at summertime pack events. There is recognition available for:

- Packs who plan and conduct three pack activities (one each in June, July, and August).
- **Dens** with an average attendance of at least half their members at the three summer pack events.
- Boys who participate in all three summertime pack events.

Cub Scout Outdoor Activity Award



All Cub Scouts have the opportunity to earn the Cub Scout Outdoor Activity Award, and boys may earn the award in each of the program years as long as the requirements are completed that year. This award recognizes the Scout's participation in outdoor

recreation and conservation projects, and can often be earned in conjunction with other Scouting activities.

National Den Award

The National Den Award recognizes dens that conduct a quality, year-round program. It can be earned only once in any 12 months. Service projects, field trips, character development, and Cub Scout camping are areas that are emphasized. Dens earn the award as a team, not as individual den members.
